Readings for the 1st Sunday in Advent:

## Isaiah 64:1-9

1) The writer of this chapter is pleading with God to defend them from their enemies. He prophetically asks God to "tear open the heavens and come down". In what way did God "come down"?

2)	Have you ever prayed a prayer like this? How did God show up for you?
3)	How does declaring "I am the clay" give you hope? What does it mean for you to have Hope?
1)	Mark 13:24-37 The gospel reading of Mark foretells of a time when the Son of Man will return with "great power and glory". This telling is a repeat of the plea from the book of Isaiah for God to come to his defense. Jesus tells the story of the Fig tree and another about the master of the house going on a journey and reminds the servants that they don't know when he will return. Jesus tells us to "Keep awake!" How do the words of Jesus bring comfort and hope to you?

How does this verse challenge you? Does it reveal an attribute of God's character?
