

Psalm 129 Explain the Context:

What is the theme of these verses?	What is the BIG Idea?
What is something that surprised you?	What are these verses <i>not</i> saying?

Take a moment to consider these questions:

1) Why do you think there would be a song of persecution and lament so close to the end of the Journey of Ascent?

2) How often do you "remind" God of all that you've been through and honor Him for His presence and provision through it all?



3) Have there been times you have prayed for God to take revenge on those who have hurt you? What did that feel like for you?

4) Knowing that Jesus most likely "sang" these Songs of Ascent on his own pilgrimages to Jerusalem, how does it make you feel about the tone of this Psalm?

5) In Romans 11 the Apostle Paul writes that the Gentiles are grafted into the body of Christ because of their belief in Him. In that sense – we ARE Israel? In light of that truth, how do we pray for the persecuted church today?
